








Unique aspects of Cohesion policy

- Eliminating disparities, convergence and competitiveness.
- Key **investment** resource.
- Territorialy oriented and framed (urban space as a driven force).
- Embedded in partnership.
- Based on strategies and needs.
- Lever for **change** (structural & instit'nal reforms).
- Crucial for single market realization.

€0.8 to EU15 GDP for every €1 spent in Visegrad 4 countries

















Achieving the SDG targets in the CZ (OECD, 2017)
