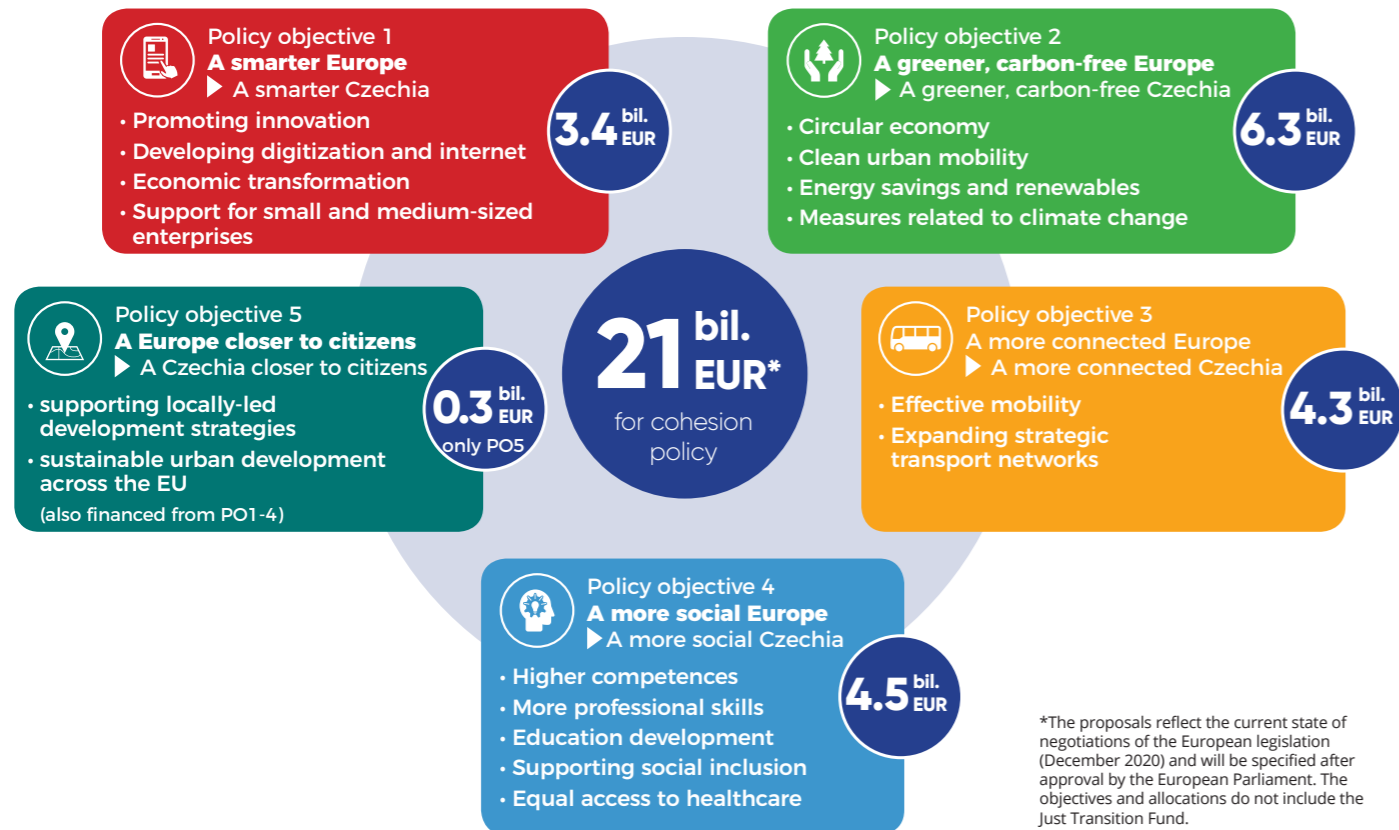

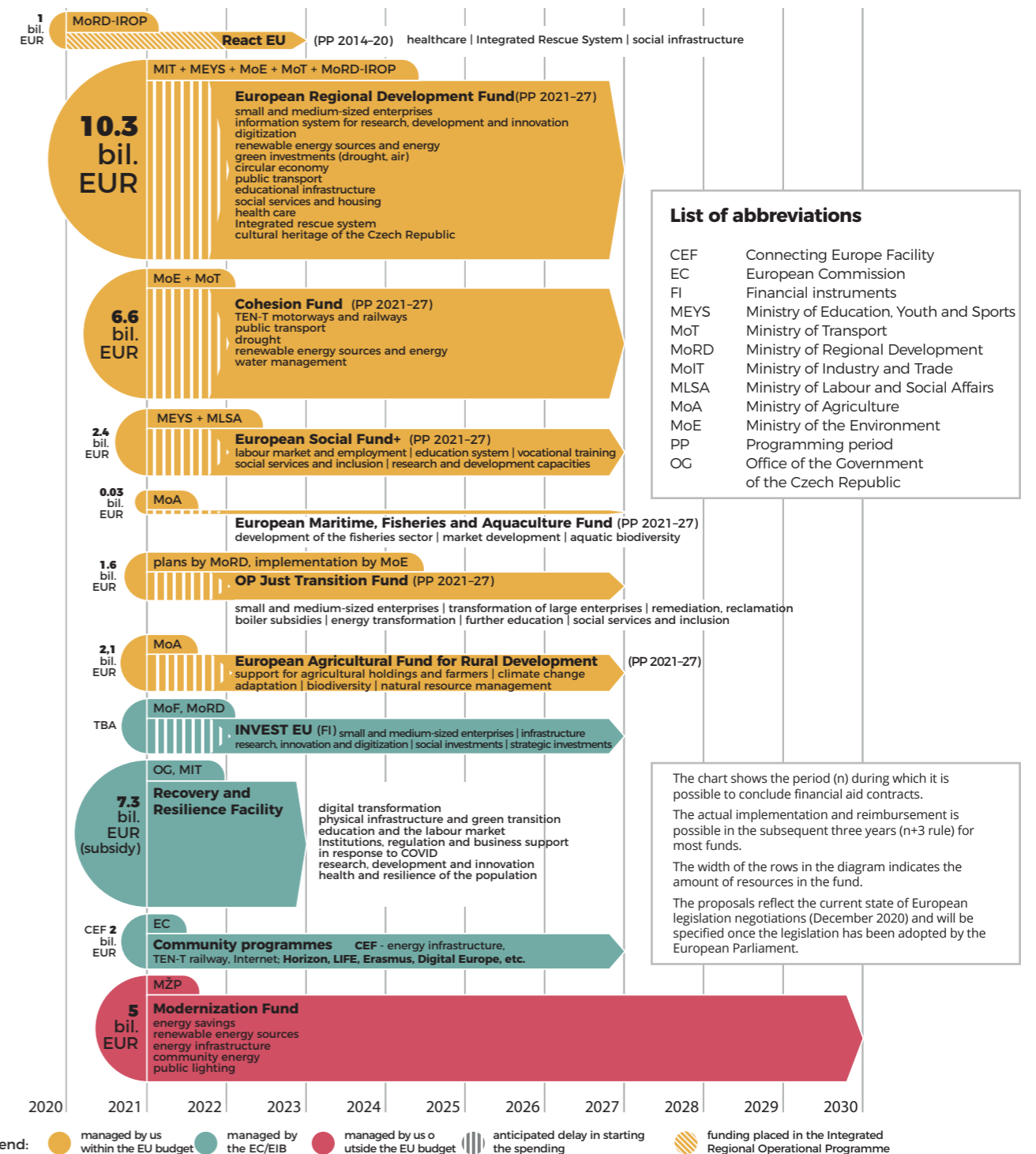


European funds in the Czech Republic after 2020

After 2020, the Czech Republic will be able to **use funding from many European funds and initiatives**, whether in the form of non-refundable **grants or financial instruments** – favourable loans. From next year, applicants will be able to apply for support for their projects under eight operational programmes that follow on from the programmes of the current period.


The Ministry of the Environment is developing a new programme focusing on coal regions and financed from the Just Transition Fund. The REACT-EU funding will be offered in new calls to be announced still under the current Integrated Regional Operational Programme 2014–2020. The European Commission is proposing to detach the Rural Development Programme from the cohesion policy. The individual programme proposals can be finalised only after the relevant European legislation is adopted. The first calls under the new programmes are expected to be published in the first half of 2022.

The overview of operational programmes corresponds to the state in which they were submitted to the government in October 2020.

Possible changes in the allocations and focus of operational programmes may still occur during the negotiation on the Partnership Agreement and operational programmes with the European Commission.

The Partnership Agreement, the overarching strategy for cohesion policy in the Czech Republic, will be presented in the summer of 2021 and subsequently negotiated with the European Commission. The first calls for some of the programmes of the new 2021-2027 programming period could be announced at the end of this year (that is 2021), with majority of the calls starting in the first half of 2022.
